## Moral Development Policy

## *"Each one of you is a child of God"* Pope Francis

Moral development should help each child gain an intuitive understanding of what is right and wrong. Children are taught the process of reflecting on an event or experience and taking into account what should happen to best promote the gospel values of love, honesty and fairness. Children are encouraged to make decisions based on their own beliefs and values and recognise that other people's may differ from their own. In essence ~ 'What would Jesus do?'

- Dishonesty
- Racism

Catholic moral teaching is the teaching of what happiness is and how it can be achieved, through the ways of loving ourselves and others as shown to us by Jesus. The principles of Catholic moral teaching include:

- The dignity of the human person
- The importance of human freedom and of the common good
- A proper understanding of conscience

At All Saints' Catholic Primary we work towards this through:
