REMOTE LEARNING AND ON-LINE HOMEWORK AT ALL SAINTS 2020-21

We were so pleased to welcome back the children to school in September so that we could provide face to face teaching. Although we had hoped that the majority of our children would have an uninterrupted experience, many individual children, class bubbles and now indeed the whole school, need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education. (Once children return, we will not be providing work for children who are withdrawn from school who do not need to isolate).

This meets the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support'

The school will use the online apps (Tapestry for EYFS and Seesaw for years 1-6) to post work for children who are unable to come into school. These are the platforms that we used during full lockdown. The children will be re-trained to use these platforms in school and homework will be set using these platforms so that they are familiar with them and any problems accessing from home can be remedied. In the inbox on Seesaw there is a video made by Mr Barton explaining how to use Seesaw and another one explaining how to upload work.

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning and stationary as required. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (e.g., laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents should make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

Work set on these platforms will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

The Overview

The daily timetable will include:

- Daily Live Youtube fitness session with Mr Tyson
- Daily class Zoom meeting/lesson at 10am
- Maths –including resources from White Rose Maths and Number Bots / X Tables Rockstars
- Reading Using the Oxford Owl on line scheme or completing an uploaded reading worksheet
- Writing Using the Hey Pobble 365 Picture of the Day or a task set by the teacher
- Spelling/Phonics Phonics Play / Spelling Shed
- Two foundation subjects learning linked to the year group curriculum Using the Oak National Academy or an uploaded lesson from your teacher

The Oak National Academy.

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via Seesaw or Tapestry.

Any work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Contact with pupils/ parents

Parents are able to contact the school via telephone or the school admin email address or for questions directly linked to remote learning on the dedicated email address homelearning@allsaintsprinmary.net. Teachers will give feedback on any work submitted via Seesaw or Tapestry. Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by the Learning Mentor Team on a weekly basis and support offered as necessary.

Sharing personal data

Keeping devices secure
